



Can cover large areas and is dense. Spreads rapidly in sun or shade Violet flowers appear in late spring; small leaves retain color into winter.

Creeping Mazus



Looks great on a low wall or spreading across the dry, sun-soaked ground in your garden! A superb ground cover for hot, dry locations, its habit is low and mounding, only 12 to 18 inches high but spreading vigorously 18 to 36 inches a year. In summer, deep blue-violet flowers arise in great masses. The rich color stays true even in the hottest days, refusing to bleach or fade. Very deer-, drought-, and pest-resistant, Irene is a long-lived joy in any well-drained garden soil. Best performance is in full sun

Irene Rosemary



Returns year after year for three solid months of fresh, neat foliage, plus two seasons of cheery blue blooms! The sword-like foliage stands straight up and out, 8 to 10 inches tall, creating a neat appearance for edging, the front of the border, or mixed plantings. Beginning in late spring and continuing into summer, deep blue blooms with yellow-starred centers dot the foliage.

Lucerne Blue-Eyed Grass



Basically can be a carpet for the spring garden, a container standout, a cover-up for unique areas of yard! Tiny yellow blooms top it in midsummer, and in autumn, In cold northern climates, this succulent's foliage will turn shades of brilliant orange before dying back for winter.

Angelina Sedum



Full bunches of buttery yellow flowers in early summer, then re-blooming throughout the summer. Blooms are held on naked stems over clumps of arching, 2 ft. tall and wide, bright green, blade-like foliage. Plant in full sun to partial shade in well drained soil. They are tough, cold and drought tolerant, long-lived, carefree, and pest resistant. Use most anywhere in the landscape!

Stella d' Oro Daylily



Purple Myrtle

The blooms arise in mid- to late spring, held up well for maximum showiness. 'Perfect for overplanting the spring-blooming bulb garden, for covering poor soil quickly, or for blanketing the dusty spaces beneath trees and shrubs where few other plants are happy.



Gaura Passionate Blush

This variety offers a compact habit and delicate blush-colored flowers that rise above mounds of dark foliage. Compared with the standard Gaura's larger size, This smaller plant is ideal for containers. Also works in gardens, borders and beds.



Lavender Pinnata

Fragrant flowers and leaves, beautiful in herb gardens and excellent in containers. Attracts butterflies. Dried flowers and leaves are prized for potpourri. Winters well in containers indoors.



Coreopsis Nana

A favorite of butterflies! Very low, spreading habit, ideal at garden's edge, as a small-scale ground cover or in the rock garden. Attractive planted with other ground cover or ferns at woodland's edge; more shade tolerant than other coreopsis varieties.



Euryops Sonnenschein

Bright cheerful flowers cover this plant, attracting butterflies to the garden. Unique, finely divided leathery foliage has a shrublike habit. Great in rock gardens or beds. Needs protection from sudden frost and harsh



Rosemary Arp

Rosemary Arp gets its name from being discovered in Arp Texas. This plant attracts butterflies and birds. It is a very drought tolerant and the flowers are blue and very fragrant



Rosemary Prostratus

A low, spreading rosemary with fragrant, needle-like green leaves. Lovely when allowed to cascade over walls or containers. May be used fresh or dried in a variety of dishes.



Leucanthemum Darling Daisy

Beautiful daisy flowers are great for summer bouquets. Also attractive in butterfly gardens or combined with other perennials such as iris, poppy, daylily or yarrow. Remove faded flowers down to the next visible bud to promote rebloom.



Phlox Sub Emerald Blue

Profuse flowers carpet the garden. Excellent evergreen ground cover for banks, rock gardens, along walkways, at garden's edge or cascading over stone walls. Creates a colorful spring show in mass plantings or with spring bulbs.



Veronica Georgia Blue

Brilliant flowers attract butterflies to the garden and complement beautiful bronzed foliage. Excellent as a small-scale ground cover or a lovely display at garden's edge, or in a rock garden. Vigorous and easy to grow.



Dianthus Firewitch

A profusion of fragrant flowers and blue-green foliage make a beautiful display in the hummingbird or rock garden, at garden's edge or as a small-scale ground cover. Attractive planted with artemisia or catmint. Prefers a sweet (alkaline) soil pH.



Scabiosa Butterfly Blue

Exceptionally long-blooming flowers attract butterflies to the garden's edge or rock garden. Both flowers and seed heads are lovely in arrangements. Prefers partial shade in hot summer climates; avoid wet soil in winter. 2000 Perennial Plant of the Year



Dianthus Frosty Fire

The Dianthus 'Frosty Fire', is a wonderful double red flowered Dianthus. It has grassy blue-gray foliage and profuse blooming time. These fragrant flowers look wonderful as a border plant, rock gardens, along walks or paths, for edging and a definite in cottage gardens
